The Mesa-Yakushev Duo is Cuban-American cellist **Thomas Mesa**, winner of the \$50,000 First Prize in the 2016 Sphinx Competition, and Russian pianist **Ilya Yakushev** (www.ilyayakushev.com), with many awards and honors to his credit. The duo's career was launched in part by their extremely successful showcase for presenters at Weill/Carnegie Recital Hall, the result of winning APAP's highly competitive 2017 Young Performers Career Advancement audition.

Since then, the Mesa-Yakushev Duo has performed at venues and festivals from coastto-coast, including the Flagler Museum in Palm Beach; La Jolla Athenaeum; California Center for the Performing Arts in Escondido; Nantucket Musical Arts; Wildflower Festival and ArtQuest Festival in Pennsylvania; Bryant University in Rhode Island; the North Dakota Museum of Art; Mayville State University; and Community Chamber Concerts, Bryan, TX.
